Our society has come along way since its humble beginnings and has been based at its permanent location on the site of the Nottingham Transport Heritage Centre for some 20 years, being an enthusiastic and active participant in the work carried out at the centre, alongside their full size 'Great Central Railway' colleagues. The Heritage Centre site also accommodates a bus museum and workshop, railway workshop, locomotive shed, cafeteria, new platform for the GCRN as well as a visitor centre. The society's location is also an excellent location to operate traction engines and road vehicles in a safe and environment along side the track and clubhouse.

Many thousands of hours and not inconsiderable amounts of money have resulted in an extensive track system that caters for all popular gauges, including Gauge 1, 3, $\frac{1}{2}$ ", 5" and 7, $\frac{1}{2}$ ". In addition to the excellent track facilities, that also include a recently completed covered 7, $\frac{1}{2}$ " g steaming bay, we also boast a clubhouse, complete with audio-visual facilities. This leads through to an impressive workshop that can cater for the needs of those members who either do not have their own workshop, or need access to



larger machine tools. Few societies, it is believed, can rival these extensive facilities that are open to all members several times a week.
